



Working Together Team, Lincolnshire-Risk Assessment Guidance

Description of activity: Setting visits from September 2020

Location: Mainstream schools and academies in the outreach teacher's locality

When considering potential visits to schools/academies individual WTT teachers will need to review:

1. Is the visit essential to WTT's work? Can it be done in any other way- virtual meet, phone or email?
2. Read and apply WTT risk assessment (below)
3. Request and read the settings risk assessment regarding visitors in school.
4. Consider if all of the controls can be met before confirming a visit to the setting.
5. Complete a Risk-Benefit Analysis for the essential visit.
6. RBA reviewed and agreed by manager before visit confirmed.
